


Towards a Caring Campus



Profile of Speakers



Meehyun Chung is a systematic theology professor and serves as the chaplain at the United Graduate School of Theology, Yonsei University in Seoul, Korea. She is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea. She holds a doctorate in theology from Basel University in Switzerland. Prior to her current position, Meehyun served as the vice president for the Ecumenical Association of Third World Theologians and as a board member of the alumni association of the University of Basel, Switzerland and worked as the head of the Women and Gender Desk at Mission 21, Protestant Mission in Switzerland.

Roberto C. Yap S.J. is the president of Ateneo de Manila University. He received his PhD from University College London, specializing in environmental economics. He likewise holds a master in public policy from the Harvard University Kennedy School of Government; a master of arts in theology from Ateneo de Manila University; a master of arts in economics from New School for Social Research, New York and a bachelor of arts in economics (honors program) from Ateneo de Manila University. He was also the former president of Xavier University – Ateneo de Cagayan.

Ruth Srininta Tarigan is a full-time lecturer at the international business management program at Petra Christian University, Indonesia. She holds a bachelor degree in computer science from Sepuluh Nopember Institute of Technology, Indonesia, and an MBA from Alliance Manchester Business School, United Kingdom. She has experience in banking and start-up before becoming a full-time academic. Her research focuses on e-commerce and information system.

Tony Sam George is currently the dean of social sciences and the head of psychology at CHRIST (Deemed to be a University), Bangalore, India. He formerly founded and directed the Centre for Academic and Professional Support at the University. He completed his doctoral training at the National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences. He is a visiting fellow to the Autonomous Medical University of Mexico at St Louis Potosi and the University of Western Cape, South Africa. He was also an alumnus of the United Board Fellows Program. He is a practising psychotherapist and has a clinical interest in group, family, and couples therapy.
